For the online Math Placement Test, you may use scratch paper but not a calculator. The Math Placement Test is a diagnostic tool designed to help assess the readiness of incoming students at USCB for various mathematics courses. Please note:

Enrolling in an inappropriate math course may adversely affect your college career. It is wise to enroll in a course appropriate to your current abilities. The "test" consists of 32 multiple choice questions with a 45 minute time limit. You should have a pencil and scratch paper available and answer the questions to the best of your ability. Please do not use a calculator or obtain assistance from outside sources. This tool is simply an assessment of your current mathematical ability and provides information on where your studies should begin. Your score will be provided after you finish.
